Emergency Supply Guidance

Community Based and Long-term/Assisted Living Care Sites

In alignment with <u>PreparedBC Guidelines</u>, HEMBC encourages community – based and longterm care/assisted living care sites to maintain a basic supply of emergency resources. These supplies support staff to shelter in place or evacuate safely during emergencies when access to external resources may be interrupted.

Please note: This guidance is not a requirement or mandate. HEMBC does not provide funding for emergency supplies and each site or organization is responsible for determining their own level of preparedness and funding allocation.

Minimum Recommended Supplies

Water

- 4 litres of emergency water per staff* member expected on site at any given day for a minimum of three – days (72 hours). The recommended breakdown includes:
 - 2 litres for drinking
 - 2 litres for food preparation and hygiene





Food

• Three days (72 hours) supply of food per staff* expected on site at any given day

Light & Communication

- Flashlights: Battery powered or hand-crank
- Extra batteries
- Phone charger, power bank, or inverter
- Whistles
- Two-way radios



^{*}For LTC/AL, residents/clients will already be covered for emergency food and water through food services agreements







First Aid & Hygiene

- First aid kit, including, but not limited to:
 - o Bandages
 - o Antiseptic
 - o Pain relivers
 - o Gloves
- Face masks
- Hygiene items, including but not limited to:
 - Hand sanitizer
 - Wipes or toilet paper
- Garbage bags

- Call-out list
