Substance Use Discharge Planning: ED Huddle Education Tool

Case Study

Your patient who uses substances and is on OAT (opioid agonist therapy) is now medically stable and nearing discharge. What considerations are required to ensure a safe discharge?

Answer

- Start planning as soon as possible and on an ongoing basis before discharge
- Provide discharge prescriptions or medications
 - Buprenorphine can be given or prescribed as take-home doses (BTG Kits)
 - Review BTG home induction (traditional induction or micro-dosing induction)
 - o **Methadone** and **SROM** prescriptions to be filled by community pharmacy
 - Send prescriptions to community pharmacy, contact pharmacy and/or community prescriber directly,
 when possible, to provide relevant information. e.g. discharge summary
- Offer connection resources for continuity of care
 - Support with connection to a community prescriber and/ or pharmacy as needed: <u>Lighthouse Virtual</u>
 Substance Use Care Clinic, Rapid Access Addiction Clinic (RAAC)
 - o For further support to connect with care a referral to outreach service (Overdose Outreach Team)
- Offer harm reduction resources that aligns with patient's goals (e.g. OPS map, safer use supplies, education materials)
- Discuss with patient if any support people should be alerted of their treatment plan (e.g family, friends, supportive housing staff). Offer to give a copy of important paperwork to them.
